While there they did a whale watching trip, but the humpback whales in that area migrate south for the winter, so to continue their cetacean education efforts, Cynde McInnis and her team developed... The Whalemobile. A life-sized inflatable humpback whale based on a real individual whale named Nile. Not only is the inflatable to scale, it is anatomically correct both inside and outside. We were so excited to get the Whalemobile down from Massachusetts and to the top of our mountain. We worked with Tucker County Schools to get field trips in for the day, and then featured the Whalemobile for Monday Night Science. It was a huge hit, and another special thanks to Mike Goss for donating food for the event from Tucker County's own Sirianni's Cafe.
